Sketching & Measuring Your Space

Use the graph paper area on the right to draw a sketch of your floor plan. Starting at the entrance, go around the room and draw in any built-ins, windows, and doors (showing which way they swing).

Next, grab your tape measure and your room plan sketch and jot down basic measurements. (These numbers don't have to be perfect, but they should be correct to the nearest inch.)

- Length and width of room
- Windows (width from the outside of the molding; height from the floor to the bottom of the sill)
- Doors (width from the outside of the molding; also indicate left or right door swing)
- Radiators (height, width, depth)
- Built-ins
- Fireplaces (width from end to end of mantel; depth of hearth)

Are there pieces or items you want to keep in the room? Art? A TV? Existing furniture? Rugs? Record their basic size so you can draw them onto the grid and see how they'll fit.
